
Ford Dunton 2025 F24 Event Format

Timetable

Racing Format

- Each car will compete in 4 of the 6 heats, including two before and two after the lunch break. Prior to the event, cars will be split into three groups, one group will compete in heats 1,2,4,and 5; another heats 1,3,4, and 6; the third in heats 2,3,5, and 6. See above.
- The winner is the car that completes the greatest combined distance over their four heats (all four distances added together).
- Each heat runs to a duration 45 minutes.
 - At least one driver change must be performed per heat.
 - Each driver must drive for no more than 40 minutes per heat.
 - Each driver must drive in no more than three of the four heats.
- Only one set of batteries can be used for each pair of heats (morning and afternoon).
- Between a pair of heats using the same batteries, teams may only make essential repairs to their cars, which will remain in a park fermé area. The chief scrutineer must give permission for any changes to be made during this time. There is no restriction during the lunch break, when batteries must be replaced before the afternoon session.
- A penalty points system will be in place at this event. There will be a maximum points limit which will result in a car being immediately removed from the session and their distance from that heat will not be counted towards the overall results. Full details of this will be communicated to teams prior to the event. Teams will acquire a penalty point from:
 - Requiring recovery
 - Causing a red flag
 - \circ Colliding with another car
 - Dangerous driving
 - \circ $\,$ Any other rule violation, should the Clerk of the Course deem it appropriate

Awards & Qualification

Trophies will be awarded to the three cars that achieve the greatest distance over the course of the four heats.

The two cars that achieve the greatest distance over the course of the four heats who have not already qualified for the International Finals will receive an invitation to attend the event in the F24 class.
