



We have several partner organisations delivering Greenpower in other countries, and if your team would like to take part in an event, please reach out so we can put you in touch. One observation this year is that some young people think they can only take part in Greenpower at certain school ages. Some participate in primary school but don't continue in secondary, while others take part in the F24 programme but don't realise they can stay involved through sixth form, college, university, or even up to age 25. You may not know that young people can also participate through youth organisations. Greenpower is very flexible—while they may finish with a specific team, that doesn't mean the opportunity ends. We also love keeping past participants involved as volunteers, Technical Committee members, Trustees, or Ambassadors. If any past participants would like to stay involved, please do reach out.

Finally, as a charity, we rely on generous supporters—both organisations and individuals. To help our fundraising efforts, I'll be cycling Land's End to John O' Groats on 10 May. I'm sure all teams have had a good look through the regulations, and noticed any F24 updates for 2025.

Goblin teams will be glad to know that the only changes have been to the sporting regulations. If you haven't already, we would encourage you to familiarise yourselves with the regulations. Please also share with your team members too. The regulations may not be the most exciting read, but they are a fundamental part of the Greenpower programme. They outline the technical and safety requirements, helping team members understand what's needed to fully participate in the events. DRIVING TIPS

If you're preparing your new team members around driving on tracks in an F24 Car or Goblin Car keep it simple & consistent;

- Goblin cars, ensure that the drivers know where their controls are and that they know to release the acceleration button when they brake.
- Goblin cars, accuracy and driving carefully is far more important than speed when doing slalom.
- For both the F24 and Goblin, it's always important to keep calm and don't panic when driving, and be considerate of others who are also driving their own cars.
- ► For F24s make sure team members know how use their mirrors, and are able to check the mirrors are positioned correctly. You can do this by making sure the person in the car can see the knees of team-mates standing behind the car, just outside the rear wheels (ie where an overtaking car would be).

- When driving on track in F24, or doing the sprint in a Goblin, it's important drivers hold their line & be steady & predictable when near other cars.
- For F24s driving on track, if cars slow right down due to battery energy levels or other reasons, it's important to either stick to the inside of the track or outside of the track and don't cut across the track, unless coming into the pit, and when doing so, making sure Mirrors are checked.
- Above all else, the last thing, ask the question - 'what is your number one priority?'. The response is usually 'be fast' or 'keep to the inside' say 'no - your number one priority is stay out of trouble - it is a long race, if someone is driving badly, keep out of their way.'

EVENT UPDATES AND OPPORTUNITIES

You'll see that we have now released the event dates. One of our priorities this year is to reconnect with and encourage more teams to take part in Goblins. Unfortunately, due to Covid, there was a drop-off in participation. On a positive note, the number of teams has slowly crept up each year, but we want to do more to support primary schools in getting back into the programme. If you know of a local team that could do with a little support to get re-established, please let us know. We have also planned more Goblin events this year.

Regarding the F24 and F24+ events, we were pleasantly surprised by such a positive response, with many events selling out. We are working hard to ensure as many teams as possible can attend and have created waiting lists to give everyone the opportunity to take part. We are also continuing to identify new venues so that we can expand further. Here are a few of the fantastic stories we have heard about the impact of Greenpower projects:



"We had a boy who would not really communicate with others. However, he really opened up during the project and we were amazed by his confidence. His mum also commented how he had grown as a person."


KEY DATA FROM OUR 2024 SURVEY
